### MEETINGS:

#### NIGHT MEETING

**WHEN:** Wednesday June 29th, 7 pm

**WHERE:** Salvation Army London Citadel (555 Springbank Drive – the corner of Springbank Drive and Wonderland Road)

#### DAY MEETING

**WHEN:** Thursday June 30th, 10 am

**WHERE:** Eastern Star Temple (800 Fanshawe Park Road East, London)

*Masks continue to be mandatory to be worn at the meetings.* The Board members feel it is still for the best of our members (bring of the vulnerable demographic) to have this practice continuing. Of course should you feel ill or have been in close contact with someone who has tested positive for COVID-19, we ask that you do not attend the meeting and reach out to one of our board members should you require anything in the meantime.

### RE-ENGAGING AT OUR MEETINGS:

Introduced at the May meetings, some small tweaks to the meeting process were tried. These small changes, we hope, provide maximum flexibility to members and will encourage members to engage/re-engage with other members and the Board.

The doors will be opened as soon as the room is set up and Board members are prepared.

Members are encouraged to follow the following process - however we don't expect you to get it right at first try! So please return and try, try again.

1. Find a comfortable seat.
2. Choose new projects and sign them out with Phyllis (night meeting) or Sian/Lucia (day meeting). Please return empty mesh bags to Phyllis and Sian/Lucia. They will also ask how many blankets you are handing in and will try to match those blankets to projects signed out previously.

\*Members who choose to not stay for the meeting can hand their blankets into Marion (primary) or a Board member and then leave.

3. Members staying for the meeting are asked to "display" their finished blankets on the table; members who are intrigued by what they see will have time to check out other members' blankets.
4. Meeting items will be kept as brief as possible but with lots of time for discussions, questions and suggestions.

5. Members will "present" their blankets and leave them folded on the table - if a blanket is chosen for possible entry in Western Fair, the member will be given a paper tag on which they put their name and date of birth (Western Fair requirement) and pin it to the blanket.
6. When all the blankets have been presented there will be a period of time for members to check on new patterns etc.

Marion will supervise the blanket collection.

There is usually time at the end of each meeting for time to be spent crocheting, seeking help and visiting! Please take advantage of this opportunity.

P.S. It's helpful if you wear a name tag - we may already have one with your name or can make one (see Fran) or use one of your own!

## **OUR NEW MISSION & VISION STATEMENTS**

A Mission Statement outlines what we do and who we serve. It provides important information to donors (who donate yarn or make one time/ yearly donations); investors (companies or government agencies that give us money or support the Club financially in other ways, - usually larger amounts and on a regular basis) and individuals who are interested in joining the Club to give back to the community. It also serves as a constant reminder to members and the Board of who we are and what we do. The Club's original Mission Statement has been revised, reviewed by members at the May meetings and is presented here.

### ***Mission Statement:***

"We provide crocheted blankets to charitable organizations that serve people in need and to individuals and families who would benefit from our support. We serve a broad spectrum of people, including but not limited to, children, adults, seniors, the homeless, Indigenous people, new Canadians, people living in poverty and victims of violence or unfortunate circumstances.

For our members, we aim to provide social interaction and maintain and improve mental health through practicing the art of crochet. We welcome everyone and membership brings the satisfaction of giving back to the community."

A Vision Statement outlines long term goals or simply states our reason for being.

### ***Vision Statement***

"To be an inclusive, welcoming organization that supports agencies and individuals through the distribution of hand-crafted, one-of-a-kind blankets that are made with love by our members."

## **WESTERN FAIR FIBRE ARTS COMPETITION**

## TAX RECEIPTS


