Blankets donated over the past month:

- 15 full size blankets were donated to 37 Frank in Strathroy. 37 Frank Youth Centre is run under Youth Unlimited YFC Southwestern Ontario. They have seen a growing need for emergency places to stay a few nights in between tragedy and government assistance which is why they are fundraising for their very own emergency crash beds to be able to provide immediate help to keep teens out of the cold.
- 10 full size blankets were donated to The Salvation Army. These blankets will be given to homeless persons when the SA provides hot meals to the homeless. We are hoping that Erin who looks after the food truck might be able to join the meeting if she is back in time.
